America's biggest drug problem isn't on the street...

It's in our medicine cabinets.

Medication thrown out in the trash or flushed down the toilet can find their way into the water table. In 2008 an [Associated Press] investigation found traces of prescription drugs in the drinking water of 41 million Americans.

2 in 5 teens believe that prescription drugs are much safer than illegal drugs. Every day on average 2,500 teens use prescription drugs to get high for the first time.

Unintentional drug poisonings in 2009 killed at least 1,373 Ohioans, an average of nearly 4 per day.

The Coalitions in Butler County along with participating local law agencies and the DEA, have collected and destroyed 4,229 pounds of prescription drugs during the 3 previous Take Back events.
