Volunteer Stream Monitoring in Southwest Ohio Next Sampling Day - June 11



What ARE those cleared areas on the bottom of my creek?

As you collect your water samples this summer, keep your eyes open for small cleared areas in the bottom of the stream, like the one above, or a shallow round depression if the bottom is sandy. Although they look like somebody took a vacuum cleaner to the stream bottom, or stuck a bowl into the sand, these structures are really the nests of any of a number of sunfish species.

Male sunfish select an area on the bottom that is just right, then sweep away the silt by fanning their tails. They will even pick up the rocks in their mouths and move them into just the right places! After the nest is ready, a female will lay thousands of eggs in that

• Canoeing - on Great Miami River, from Trenton to Rentschler Park in Hamilton. PLEASE RSVP YOUR INTEREST IMMEDIATELY so we can finalize details. What we think right now is we will meet at Rentschler Park at 8:45 at parking area directly across from Riverview Shelter. We will carpool to Trenton so we can pick your cars at Rentschler after lunch. Canoes are being loaned by Rivers Unlimited, but we space. After fertilization, the male will guard the eggs until they hatch or even for some days after hatching. Males usually hover just above the nest, aggressively chasing away anything that might harm the eggs - including you!

In Ohio streams, we have a beautiful assortment of 6 sunfishes: Bluegill, Green, Longear,

Orangespotted, Pumpkinseed, and Redear Sunfish.

Click on any of the names above to go to Ohio Division of Wildlife's fact sheet, complete with a picture, life history and other great information. But just for fun, let me show you my favorite sunfish, the Longear Sunfish ... what a beauty!



These stream dwellers can get up to about 7" in length if they have good deep pools with clear water to help them find their invertebrate prey and keep it available through our late summer dry times. This is another reason large woody debris is important habitat in streams - not only do log jams help create deep pools that hold water during dry spells, but they provide lots of surfaces for invertebrates to cling to.

All of these true sunfishes (genus *Lepomis*) are joined in the larger family of sunfishes (Centrarchidae) by white and black crappies, rock bass, and the black basses (smallmouth, largemouth and striped). So Ohio is well represented with these delightful creatures!
