September was a very busy month, with the Great Miami River Days festival, our first Stream Team canoeing trip, and a field trip to the lab for an area high school group. e out some nice pictures of the <u>festival</u> and <u>canoe trip</u> here.

The **Great Miami River Days** is one of the largest water education events in the country and was attended this year by **tens of thousands** of interested citizens. The Stream Team booth attracted a lot of attention, especially on Saturday afternoon when we set up all our lab equipment (well, almost all) to analyze about 60 samples.

All these students are enrolled in a 2-year Master of Environmental Sciences program (M.En.). They are preparing to enter environmental careers at mid-level management levels. These careers may include anything from environmental education to environmental science editing to regulation or policy-making.

IES has been in existence for 40 ears, with over 600 graduates to its credit. The program is very interdisciplinary, as are all environmental concerns, so the students spend their first year learning some of the basics about environmental measurements, problemsolving methodologies, policy, statistics, law, and current issues. The second year is focused on the particular student's area of interest, such as conservation and applied ecology, environmental communication, management and policy, resource analysis or technology. Each students finishes with a professional experience, either an internship with an existing
